Report your concerns

Safeguarding children is everyone's responsibility. If you are worried about a child, it is important that you report your concerns - **no action is not an option.**

1. If you are worried about a child, then you need to report your concerns to Ashton88 Club Welfare Officer in the first instance.

- 2. If the issue is one of **poor practice** they will either:
 - Deal with the matter themselves or
 - Seek advice from the County FA Welfare Officer

If you have concerns regarding a volunteer (coach, assistant coach, ref, home team or away team) or a parents conduct or practice-

- Please contact the clubs Welfare officer as soon as possible.
- Do not approach or challenge this behaviour yourself.
- 3. If the concern is more serious **possible child abuse or other danger** contact the Police and where possible contact the County FA Welfare Officer.
- 4. If the child needs **immediate medical treatment** call an ambulance and tell them this is a child protection concern. Let your Club Welfare Officer know what action you have taken
- 5. If at any time you are **not able to contact your Club Welfare Officer**, or the matter is serious then you can either:
